Arizona Copper Art Museum Clarkdale, AZ

Not really knowing what to expect other than seeing a bunch of copper something's, we visited this museum in June. Boy were we impressed! We would recommend you go, if you haven't already, if this kind of stuff appeals to you.

The old Clarkdale High School was converted into this museum. One thing we found interesting was each room had a plaque by the door stating what the room was originally used for, e.g., library, history, science, etc.

There were so many items displayed and history descriptions, we spent over two hours walking around looking and reading, taking pictures too. We never knew so many different items were made from copper. Senior admission price to the museum is \$8.75 each.

As a side note, the museum is 'down the street' from the Verde Canyon Railroad, which is 'down the street' from a new park (within the last few years) named Rain Spirit RV Resort, 63 sites (couldn't find any pricing figures on their web page, maybe that means \$\$\$?).
