# A Brief Comment on Moab, UT

FYI - For those who have not been to the Moab region, my comments assume dry terrain.

Perfect time of year for trip (October). Trees were turning in the canyons and cool weather. Hiking in the summer would be very limited due to temperature and sun exposure.

Their peak time is March thru October.

There are typically three key focus points: Arches National Park, Canyonlands National Park, and off road exploring.

Arches National Park requires a reservation for entry time. We hit all the sites. We added Tovar Arch which is mainly a dirt road but good out to the site and it is a 1.5 mile hike to the arch. There is a second way but it is 4WD and gets you within ¼ mile. There are not a lot of people in this area.

Canyonlands National Park is actually three areas: Islands in the Sky, Needles, and the Maze. Islands in the Sky is just north of Moab and the most popular. It is bounded by the Green River and Colorado River and where they join. Needles is about 40 miles south closer to Montecello and 35 miles in. The Maze should be considered - isolated / self sustain - it is about five hours from Moab, dirt roads, 4WD and go prepared for trails that are not mapped and no resources.

I do have maps and Funtrek for Moab 4-wheel drive trails if someone is curious.

Moab has things for both A and B types. Rent Jeeps or ATV's for off-road. Schafer Trail was fun. Go for hikes, bike trails.
